She presented it to our partner Novidade and they saw merit and opportunity for the Vera Cruz neighborhood. They modified the language and modeled it to emphasis child evangelism. She has the class every Friday and visits the families 2 days a week. We had the opportunity to attend and witness her in action and we know that this is a God matching for us and the community.

One of the real problems for our people is their level of education or lack of it. Even in this modern day we still have many who lack basic reading skills. We try to teach them that there is a better life for them and to go beyond their current circumstances. We realized that even if we told them that there was a job and go apply, they couldn't even fill out the application. I met a teacher, Valeria, and we were talking about what the community needs are, and she said education opportunities. We discussed some options and she said she would pray about it and see what direction God would lead. She came back with a literacy program, wrote the curriculum, what the needs will be to have the class. It will be for adults and it will start the beginning of this month. It will be presented twice a week with 14 students in each class and be for a 3 month session. A local pastor is donating space in his church; he is very excited to be able to participate in an opportunity to better his community.

One of the more, personally exciting new ventures is with a group of people, Corrente do Bem, "Chain of Good". They are volunteers, from various different churches, who just want to make a positive change in their community. The Principles and the driving engine are Edivan and Lucienne Estevez and Adriano

They do various projects, children's events, food and clothing distribution and building project. Last newsletter I told you how we were helping them repair a home for a 78 years old women and her bed-ridden son. (Dona Benedito & Ary)



We finished the roof and are currently removing the mold inside the house that was caused by the bad roof, which is now new. We will be patching holes and painting the walls. When we visited the house, Ary, who is bedridden and on a ventilator, was in the middle of the mold and moisture from the outside getting into the inside. (Working Guys)



We knew that we had to take on the interior after fixing the exterior. The Corrente de Bem people; like I said are all volunteers and do all the work on their days off and I've never seen a group happier to be doing what they do.

My brother, Pastor James Hart, was with us on this trip and I was so happy to be able to witness these new works and partners with him (Jim and Me)



Edivan of Corrente de Bem, told us how he was inspired by an American missionary. That even though he was not one of the kids who attended every day; he never missed any of the events or evangelism that was offered through the missionary's school. The impact from this work had such an impact that as an adult he wanted to start something to give that same love and inspiration to others. We visited several houses and he told the story to every family. I finally asked him the name of the missionary and he said Billy Hart, my father. We never know how far reaching our actions can go. I had never meet this man and had no idea of his story or life, but our family and his have always been intertwined and now God has put us together to continue His good work.
